## Kenya/Canada Legal Aid Partnership

The Kenya/Canada Legal Aid Partnership is a pilot project of Elimu Impact Evaluation Unit (<https://elimu.lab.mcgill.ca/>), a research centre and NGO located in Kianyaga, Kenya. Elimu's work focuses on measuring the practical difference of poverty alleviation initiatives such as rural electrification, microinsurance, tutoring and legal aid.

In the summer of 2021, Elimu set up a partnership with Kenyatta University School of Law (KUSOL) to test a project in which students from their faculty are paired up with students from the McGill Faculty



of Law to work on legal cases in Kianyaga remotely. The idea of this partnership is to simultaneously increase access to justice for residents of Kianyaga while also giving both McGill and KUSOL students an opportunity to experience working with lawyers trained in a different country. Both Kenya and Canada use the common law, but the project allows students to contrast and compare their legal

education while also learning some basic skills that go along with working in a clinic setting. Student participants will have a chance to not only improve on hard skills such as legal research and drafting legal opinions, but also soft skills like teamwork, communication, and time management.

As the project is in a pilot phase, this year the Kenya/Canada Legal Aid Partnership will only be selecting five students from each faculty, for a total of ten students. If the project is successful in the coming academic year, we hope to expand the project to involve more students and take on more cases.

Dictum is a student-run think tank that centers values of equity, inclusion, and questioning the status quo in fields of research and advocacy. The Think Tank aims to produce content such as op-eds, podcasts, literature reviews, and original research, alongside creating space to have dialogue around pertinent topics of equity and justice. 

## Legal Information Clinic at McGill (LICM) and Student Advocacy

### The LICM:

The Legal Information Clinic at McGill (LICM) was founded in 1973 by law students at McGill. Today, we are the largest student-run legal clinic in Canada. We are committed to increasing access to justice for the McGill and Montreal communities and to meeting the needs of students and marginalized groups because we believe that justice matters for everyone.



Legal Information's mandate is to answer students and community members' legal questions in English or French, free of charge. Law students who volunteer at the Clinic as caseworkers research and answer clients' questions over the phone. Under the supervision of the LICM's senior caseworkers and directors, caseworkers can provide clients with information on almost any area of the law (exceptions: criminal law, tax law, major construction issues and provincial law outside of Québec).

Caseworkers can also partake in three of the LICM's free Community Services: Just Info, Know Your Rights and Court Accompaniment.

- Caseworkers can give Just Info presentations to McGill student groups or to Montreal community organizations in order to make the law more accessible to their members and to let them know about their rights and responsibilities in a specific area of the law.
- Caseworkers can also take part in our Know Your Rights campaign and promote our services to McGill students and help them learn more about their housing and employment rights.
- Finally, caseworkers can take part in our Court Accompaniment program and accompany clients to their hearing at the Small Claims Court and the Tribunal administratif du logement (n.b. this service is on hold temporarily due to COVID-19).
- We offer all of these community services in English and French.

Volunteering at the LICM as a caseworker is a great way to put the legal knowledge and skills you learn in class into practice and to give back to the community by making justice more accessible to the many who cannot afford the services of a lawyer.

Law students can begin volunteering as caseworkers in the summer between 1L and 2L. We will be recruiting volunteers for the summer towards the end of March!

### **Student Advocacy:**

Student Advocacy's mandate is to provide free and confidential advice and representation in English or French to McGill students in formal or informal disputes with the university. Junior advocates negotiate, advocate and represent students with grievances or facing disciplinary proceedings under the supervision of senior advocates and the Director of Student Advocacy and University Affairs.

Junior advocates can also take part in our Know Your Rights campaign and promote our services to McGill students and help them learn more about their student rights.

For law students interested in litigation, becoming a junior advocate is a great way to gain some advocacy experience while helping out your fellow students!

Law students can begin volunteering at the LICM as junior advocates at the start of 2L. We are currently recruiting 15 junior advocates for the 2020-2021 academic year!



The Wallenberg Advocacy Group (WAG) works in common cause with the Raoul Wallenberg Centre for Human Rights (RWCHR) to engage in legal and public advocacy on behalf of imprisoned human rights defenders. In doing so, WAG remains in close contact with the RWCHR's Chair, former Minister of Justice Irwin Cotler; the RWCHR's Legal Counsel; and members of the Raoul Wallenberg All-Party Parliamentary Caucus for Human Rights in Ottawa.



Each new group of WAG members adopts a political prisoners case and cause. Our first WAG cohort adopted the case of Dr Wang Bingzhang, an imprisoned Chinese human rights defender. Our second WAG cohort adopted the case of Huseyin Celil, a Canadian citizen who is arbitrarily detained and forcibly disappeared because he is Uyghur.

WAG has engaged in a variety of legal and public advocacy initiatives on behalf of these imprisoned human rights defenders. Our legal advocacy has included preparing white papers documenting

violations of international and Chinese constitutional and criminal procedural law, drafting petitions and joint urgent appeals to the UN Working Group on Arbitrary Detention, and communicating with the Supreme People's Court of China. Our public advocacy has included coordinating an all-party Parliamentary statement, hosting an online event, sending an

open letter to the Chinese Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and publishing an Opinion-Editorial in a Canadian newspaper.

We are recruiting five or more Junior Advocates to join our team. They will likely be adopting the case and cause of Nasrin Sotoudeh, an Iranian human rights hero imprisoned for defending the dignity of the vulnerable.
